



IS YOUR GARDEN A PICNIC FOR INVASIVE PESTS?

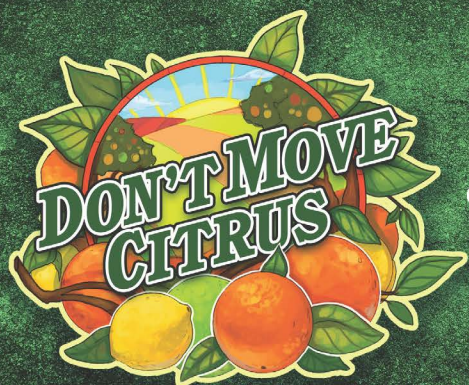
Follow these **TIPS** to fight them.

Know Your ROOTS

Only buy plants and seeds, online or in person, from **REPUTABLE** sources that follow USDA regulations.

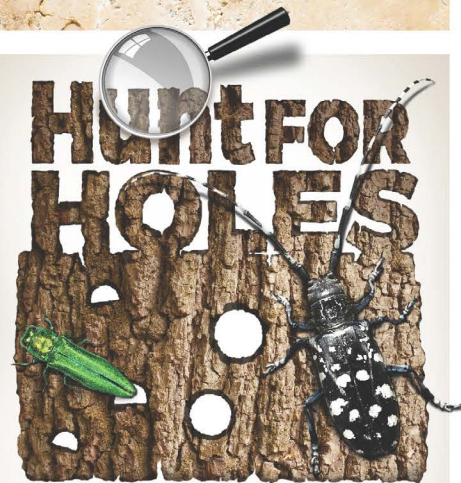


You may live in an area under quarantine for an invasive pest. Call your local **USDA OFFICE** to find out before moving homegrown produce, plants, and plant parts.



Moving citrus plants or items with citrus, such as floral arrangements, could spread a devastating citrus disease:

CITRUS GREENING.



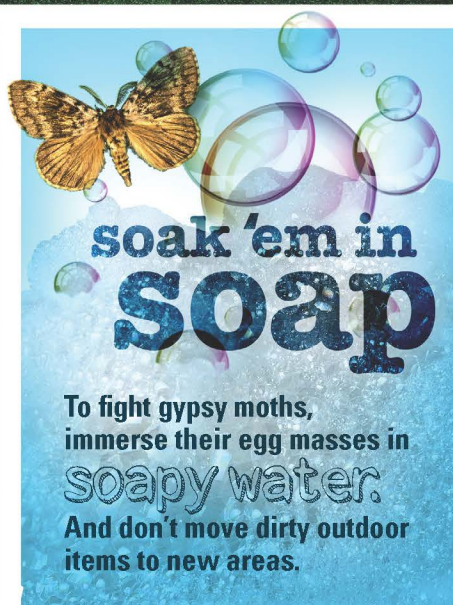
LOOK FOR D-SHAPED AND ROUND

holes in trees.

These could be signs of emerald ash borers or Asian longhorned beetles.



Call your local USDA office to find out how to safely dispose of **TREE BRANCHES** and other yard debris.



To fight gypsy moths, immerse their egg masses in soapy water. And don't move dirty outdoor items to new areas.
